197. APOLOGIES

198. EXCLUSION OF PRESS AND PUBLIC

RESOLVED that the Press and Public be excluded from the Meeting for consideration of the following items of business in accordance with Section 1(2) of the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act, 1960, on the grounds of confidentiality.

199. APPLICATIONS FOR GRANT AID

The Finance Officer introduced and presented his confidential report (circulated with Agenda), relating to applications received in response to the Town Council's public invitation to voluntary and charitable organisations to apply for grant aid for the year 2010/2011.

The report:

- identified the Terms of Reference of the Committee and indicated that (i) the Committee's recommendations would be referred to the Council meeting to be held on 21st April 2010.
- identified the emphasis that had been placed upon the organisation's (ii) response to the question of the benefit to Rhyl and that the organisation's own words had been used within the written report.
- reminded Members that they should consider whether they have a (iii) personal or prejudicial interest in any applications and whether the Rhyl Town Council Code of Conduct requires them to disclose that interest.

- (iv) advised that full copies of all applications were available for inspection at the meeting.
- (v) advised of the necessary budget and legal considerations.
- (vi) Appendix A to the report, which listed named organisations within the Council's budget that had submitted a valid application form.
- (vii) Appendix B to the report, which identified other organisations, which had submitted valid application forms and advised that there was a significant shortfall due to the applicant organisations having requested sums in total greater than in the Budget.
- (viii) Appendix C to the report, identifying organisations which had been sent application forms on request, but which had subsequently failed to make an application and one applicant that had submitted a late application.
- (ix) Appendix D to the report, identifying the relevant budgets available.
- (x) Appendix E to the report, a copy of the Grant Application Form and accompanying Advice to Applicants.
- (xi) identified a suggested procedure to be followed by the Committee in determining the applications.

With regard to the suggested procedure, a Member expressed concern that Appendix A applications were set against individual pre-identified budgets, and that it would be unfair, should the proposed awards exceed the budgets, to take any excess from the identified budget for general applications. Conversely if proposed awards were less than the identified budgets then the Member thought that this sum should be added to the budget for general applications. Following discussion it was

<u>RESOLVED</u> that in respect of Appendix A applicants, the recommended awards should not exceed the individual identified budgets, with any surplus being made available towards general applications.

The Committee, having adopted a revised procedure, considered each application individually in turn and when completed were advised by the Finance Officer that the recommended awards were in excess of the agreed budget. Thus it was necessary to consider each award again and for the committee to make appropriate reductions. The Committee considered the methodology for doing this and determined that only certain high value awards should be reviewed and this was agreed accordingly. Having completed the review the Finance Officer advised Members that the adjustments were still insufficient so Members again considered and agreed how the resulting shortfall should be addressed. Having completed the second review the total value of awards now fell exactly within budget.
