4. TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR COMMITTEES AND SUB-COMMITTEES

The Town Clerk referred to his report (circulated with agenda) seeking members' confirmation of the remit of the council's committees and sub-committees.

<u>RESOLVED</u> that the committee and sub-committee structure and scheme of delegation was approved.

5. WELSH GOVERNMENT COVID-19 FUNDING GRANT

The Town Clerk reported receipt of information from Denbighshire County Council (circulated with agenda) with regard to a potential capital grant of £108,000 from Welsh Government, to be spent on town centre recovery from the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The county council proposes to use a portion of the grant to roll out a lighting project to coincide with Christmas for all eight town centres at a cost of £5,000 each to lift spirits and encourage high street shopping.

The county council suggests that the remaining £68,000 could be accessed by city, town and community councils for further spend on eligible town centre capital expenditure, with the councils needing to provide 20% match funding that they would be able to retrospectively claim back.

Members were supportive of additional town centre lighting, but felt that the money could be better spent via direct financial support to foodbanks given that demand had vastly increased since the outbreak of the virus at the beginning of the year.

Members asked for clarification on whether the lighting would be permanent or just for the Christmas period, and suggested that the lighting of the Vale Road bridge might be positively received?

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk to:

- (i) establish the planned period of lighting and how city, town and community councils would re-claim their match funding?
- (ii) ask what finances Denbighshire County Council are to receive from Welsh Government as a result of Covid-19 as a whole, and ask for consideration to be given to an amount of it being donated to foodbanks county wide.
