



TWO teenage army cadets are to work alongside a town mayor for the next 12 months.

Royal Welsh Regiment cadets Lillie McCabe-Allen and Rhys Hatenboer will accompany Rhyl mayor Cllr Ellie Chard to some of her civic engagements.

This is just the second time cadets have been chosen to accompany the mayor, a practice started by 2018 incumbent Cllr Win Mullen-James. The honorary title pays homage to the work of service groups in the town and is shared between air, sea, and land forces.

15-year-old Lillie, who goes to Eirias High School, Colwyn Bay, and Rhyl High School pupil Rhys, 13, said they were 'honoured' to accept the positions and were looking forward to representing the town, particularly on Remembrance Day.

Rhyl Platoon Instructor Louise McCabe-Allen said the cadets were selected in recognition of their work with the army group which meets twice a week at John Street, Rhyl.
